

From the President

Guess What We're Doing! Care To Join Us?

In 1950, Evangelist Bill Rice and a group of missionaries stepped into a

jungle clearing in the heart of the Congo with Bibles in hand. My grandfather had sold his house in Wheaton, Illinois, to take the Gospel halfway around the world to pygmies who had never heard the Gospel.

When Bill Rice returned to the States, he and my grandmother began another mission outreach to another group of people who had largely never heard the Gospel. They too waited behind a language barrier to hear the Good News. They were the deaf people in America, and the Rice's own deaf daughter demonstrated to them the great need.

Just as they had sold what they owned and saved what they could to pay for their mission to the Congo, the Rices now did the same for this new mission to a forgotten people in the United States. In 1953, we hosted our first group of deaf young people here on the Ranch. They had the time of their lives! They met people who loved them and spoke their language. They heard the Gospel and trusted Christ. They came for free.

As the Ranch grew every year, so did the work. Our numbers grew. The number of lives changed grew. The Ranch staff also grew, as did our needs.


Sometimes the outreach grew by spreading across the ocean, as it did and still does with the work of Bob and Brenda Himes in the Philippines. For more than thirty years now, they have been winning and discipling deaf people, helping churches to establish deaf ministries, and hosting camps that have won thousands! Of course, the Himes are not alone in their work! God's people across this country pray and give to make their work possible.

More recently, another man named Nathan McConnell has been doing much of the same work for the Deaf as the Himes. He too helps churches establish deaf ministries. He too runs camps to reach the Deaf. He too is supported by people who believe in his work and want to play a part. The most noticeable difference between Bob Himes and Nathan McConnell is that Nathan lives here on the Ranch!

Of course, Nathan McConnell, his wife Rebekah, and their two boys are just a snapshot of an entire team of people and their families who have given themselves to the same mission that has animated everyone from Bill Rice to Bob Himes. They are giving themselves for the love of Christ and the people He died to save, and they are serving by faith. While everyone here is "on a mission," no one receives full support as a missionary. In addition, camp fees do not cover the need for all the households that serve here.

For nearly sixty years, God has taken care of generations of His servants here at the Ranch! How has God provided? God has primarily cared for His servants here through the giving of His servants from across the country! Through gifts large and small, the Lord has answered the prayers of those praying for us even as they partner with us.

The new year just around the corner is bursting with possibility. It is the best time to get some preparatory work done that we cannot do as well at another time. While we are making repairs and preparations on the Ranch and spearheading outreaches across the country, like in New York City, the income to do so is also much less than at any other time of year.



I want to thank you for your interest in the ministries of the Ranch and ask you to pray for us in these winter months. Please pray that we will maintain our momentum, that our outreach will grow, and that we will be good stewards of what we already have. Please pray that God will put His work here on the hearts of His people abroad.
