resides in Tennessee. Dale has overseen many projects at the Ranch



and will be dedicating a good chunk of time over the next year to work with the engineer to determine the course of the wastewater plans and the costs involved with water, fire protection, and wastewater. Determining



these things will put us in a better position to set a realistic goal of getting the camp completed. This information will allow us to seek the Lord and let friends know about the financial needs.
