## Final Lap: Racing toward Summer Camp

Since our last report, the Lord has enabled us to see many things accomplished on our campsite. The propane and water lines were laid, inspected, and covered. A friend from western Arizona sent three HVAC crews from his business to hook up and test the heaters and water heaters. The propane system is now fully operational!

About the same time, we had a volunteer crew from Woodbridge, Virginia, pour three concrete pads to accommodate our fresh water and fire protection tanks. They did an excellent job! A local volunteer crew is coming this week to build enclosures around the two fresh water tanks. Then the plumber can return to install the pumps and hook up the system. We are very close to completion on that project too!



Much has happened on the sanitation system, as well. Our buildings sit in two clusters. One cluster's set of 1,500-gallon septic tanks and lines have been installed, inspected, and backfilled. The remaining work includes installing the second cluster's tanks and adding two additional 5,500-gallon tanks, pumps, and the entire leech field. Please pray with us that the system will be operational by camp next month.



We have had two groups from in-state add moisture resistant green-board drywall around twenty cabin showers. This has been a long process, and we sure appreciate the multiple trips that these friends have made to camp to work on the project. Another friend from California has been here and installed a larger water heater for our mobile kitchen. He also installed two more shelves for storage. Other groups have been here
