Adding Staff

There are many blessings to serving the Lord in full-time ministry. Some hear those words "full-time ministry" and think of preaching. While preaching is important at camp, we are currently looking for a new staff member who is *not* a preacher but rather is good with his hands in maintenance. Our greatest areas of need are in electrical, plumbing, and auto mechanics. We also have a great number of small projects on the docket that would require carpentry or fence building skill. Our facilities manager would also keep up with our fresh water, sanitation, and fire suppression systems.

If you know of someone ministry-minded that could help us manage our growing facilities, please have him contact us. We envision a full-time facilities manager with a part-time spouse helping in food service and housekeeping, though we are open to other paradigms.

Moving Forward in Development

For some time now we have been raising funds toward the building of our dining hall. A donor has promised 4-to-1 matching funds, meaning that if we can raise the estimated \$250,000 needed for dining hall infrastructure, then he will donate the funds for the estimated \$1,000,000 building.

To date, we have raised over \$112,000 toward this goal (45%), and have used some of the funds toward the completed electrical expansion. We have employed a fire suppression system engineer to design the expansion of the fire system. This includes increasing from 30,000 to 180,000 gallons of water on site and adding additional fire lines and hydrants. We hope to install this expansion by next summer.

The addition of the dining hall (which will include an upgraded auditorium) will enable us to have more people on site and extend our camping season into colder months. In the meantime, we have added a platform to our open-air auditorium, and we are planning a heavier duty screen to protect from the elements.

The dining hall project also accentuates our need for a facilities manager to care for our expanding campground maintenance needs.
