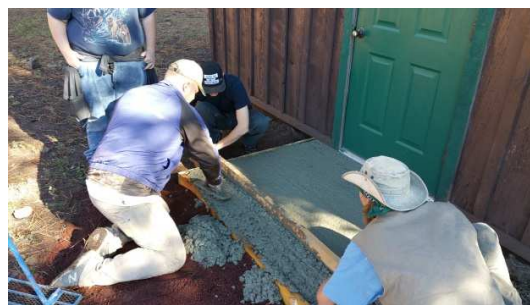
Sanitation Permit-Signed & Sealed!

Over a year ago, we received our first sanitation permit to service our camp property. However, when we put the project out to bid, a local contractor felt he could help us make the system easier to install and maintain. Also, by accommodating only the buildings we now have, it would decrease the initial cost and allow us to get into camping sooner.

Now, after going through the design and review process once again, we have received our newest sanitation permit! We praise the Lord that this has been accomplished. This should give us the time needed to install the system for use by next summer.

Just this fall, we received an additional \$50,000 toward the project. With our new cost estimate in hand, we currently have an additional need of \$54,000 to complete the project. Please pray for the Lord to meet this need and that work will start soon. Honestly, we hope groundbreaking will happen before you are reading this. In any regard, we need to make the best possible use of the time between now and heavy snowfall.

Sanitation is one of several projects we have identified as 2016 goals (see back, "Project Status"). Having camp last summer was permitted on a temporary basis. The completion of these goals should provide us a permanent occupancy. This would be a major milestone in the project.



In anticipation of all the work that must be done by next June, we were thrilled to knock out a smaller yet important project in October. Several men from Cottonwood and Kingman, Arizona, came for a Friday and Saturday to pour ten concrete pads for our cabins. These pads will serve the secondary doors. Would you be interested in donating your time and skill for one to three days next spring? Check "Workers Needed" on the back to see how you might be able to help.

Summer Staff Needs



As we prepare for three camp weeks next summer, we are actively recruiting Bible college students to serve as counselors. We need four ladies and three men for these positions. We also need several operational staff, program staff, and Ranch Hands.

We recently joined staff from our eastern location—Bill Rice Ranch, Murfreesboro, Tennessee—to recruit for two days at a western Bible college. The staff back east has made trips to three other Bible colleges, representing our needs as well.

If you know of any young people who would be interested in working with us next summer, please contact us. Counselors need to have completed at least two semesters in a West Branch approved Christian college by next summer. Ranch Hands are young men ages 15-19 who serve primarily in food service. Program staff ought to be at least college age with the ability to serve in the camp activity program. Operational staff may help with maintenance, grounds, or other functional areas.
