This year, some of our students learned how to read, do long division, use an adverb correctly, play the piano, use a protractor, write a research paper, and speak publically. These were young people who couldn't have been with us a couple of years ago and are better for being here. We look forward to adding another 2nd grade class next year!

While everyone is looking forward to the summer, I'm excited about the fall already because of more growth and improvements coming our way. Obviously, once the new school building is open, that will be a huge improvement! We'll start with at least two new classrooms and will eventually add a third classroom, a chapel, a new office, restrooms, a teacher workroom, and more. It will meet many of our current and future needs. I am also thrilled about our new Middle School Flex Period! Flex Period is a 30-minute period every day, and every day will have a different theme and purpose. It will include classes like reading for fun, split sessions (guys/girls), team meetings, and clubs. Clubs will be like electives where Middle Schoolers can choose from fun classes such as Yearbook, Maintenance, Teacher Aides, Bible Quizzing, Vocal, Chess, and more. This will be the biggest Middle School improvement since we started Middle School eight years ago. Many BRCA improvements are right around the corner.
