### Giving and Asking By Nathan Reeves

Thanksgiving is a compound word, and during this month, we often, and rightfully so, think on the first part of this word – thanks. We are to be full of gratitude throughout the year, but especially during November.

I think we should also consider the second part of this word – giving. God commands us to give; he even tells us to give *cheerfully* (II Corinthians 9:7). God also gives us a promise when we give – "He which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully." (II Corinthians 9:6b) This is a promise that God will generously give to us when we generously give to Him. So let us purpose to give to Him our time, talents, and treasures during this time of year.

When we think about giving, we must also think about the recipient of our gift. If you give to our upcoming Food Drive, many young people will be helped. There are many needy people in our lives, and the "man in the mirror" is sometime the most overlooked.

God wants us to give and to ask. We are to give cheerfully as much as we can, and we are to ask God to meet our daily needs — no matter how small they are. Make sure you are thankful this season, but do not forget to give and ask as well.




