Think about it...some severely injured hospital patients are given a medical form of heroin (that is stronger than most illegal drugs) for months, and yet they stop the medicine immediately when they get home and are surrounded by a loving family. A similar drug will turn a street user who is alone and unhappy into an addict. What's the difference?

The simple answer is connection.

God made people with a need to connect and bond. When we don't have good connections, we become unhappy and turn to other things to fill the void. Sometimes these things become addictions.

In today's social media culture, most people connect without making a true connection. We try to connect by seeing what friends & family are doing online, but this is superficial and cannot take the place of real connections with people we love. There's a huge difference between FaceTiming your sister and eating a meal with her. Superficial connections are dangerous because they make us feel as if we're connecting but still leave us wanting more.

There are several places where real connections can be made. If you don't have a good church to call home, you're really missing out.

But another great place to make connections is at BRCA. Let me encourage you to get to know your kid's friends' parents. There are plenty of school functions where you can do this – PTM's, Western Day, fieldtrips, Christmas Concert, Christmas & Valentine's Day parties, Fun Run, etc. Go to birthday parties your child is invited to. Schedule times for your kids to meet up & play with their BRCA friends, and get to know their parents.

It's interesting...some BRCA classes' parents are very close while others are not. The only reason we can tell that makes the difference is the group who has made strong connections has parents who go out of their way to meet others in the class. They see the value of connections.

Please pray for our students as they compete against hundreds of other Christian students in the Nashville area. Check back later to see how we did!


Feb. 9 Hillbilly Day


