Spring Ministry

There are two ways to look at 2023 so far: "we have had a brutal winter," or, "God has been very good to us!" Actually, both are very true. The city of Williams set a modern snowfall record this winter. We exceeded that amount at West Branch by over 20" for a total of 157" of snow. With the snow came equipment failures, building damage, general weariness, being snowbound, and even being "flood-bound." Visit us now, and you might not realize any of that, as things are getting back on track, and we are mostly in summer preparation mode now.

Without a doubt, the most remarkable thing about the year so far, however, has been the fact that we have not missed a single ministry opportunity due to the extreme conditions. We have had church meetings from January through April, and each time, we have been able to get to those preaching engagements even when we may have been snowbound for four days leading up to them! It really has been remarkable.

We did have to move our Men on the Move Conference to a different location though. By mid-February, we began wondering if our situation would normalize in time for the conference one month later. In early March, we decided to cancel the event. However, a church volunteered to host the meeting. So, we moved the whole event to north Tucson and had a wonderful meeting of Bible preaching where it was clear the Lord was working. We regret that some planning to attend could not make the switch in venue, but we truly had no other viable option. We are convinced this was of the Lord.

Since then, we have also had several Christian school senior classes come for their senior trip. We accommodate them and preach to them each day before they visit the local sites. We were blessed to have local snowmelt flooding recede enough at just the right times to make all this possible. 2023 has not gone the way we expected so far, but it is a great comfort to know that the Lord has had everything in control.

Crossing Work

The severity of the winter slowed down the progress to get bathrooms put into the Rasmussen Crossing. However, just this week some needed surveying was completed to see if the building's sewer needs can be added to the current system via gravity. If not, a lift station will be required. Fortunately, the engineer remains optimistic that one way or the other, the building will be able to be added to our current system. Our first goal is to get the permit for the addition and then see where we are financially once we get a realistic estimate of the project.
